# Outcomes 2017-18

- Across all year groups and subjects, children are currently making good progress.
- Attainment in KS1 has risen from last year in maths and is stable in writing and reading.
- Attainment in KS2 has risen from last year in reading (73%) and SPAG (70%), stayed stable in maths (68%) and dropped slightly in writing (70%). Data is broadly in line with 2017 national figures.
- Good and outstanding teaching and learning across the school
- Excellent feedback in Peer Reviews and from WMAT SIL and Diocesan SIL
- Successful Erasmus project
- Gold Sports' Award achieved



# School Priorities 2018-19



## **Outcomes:**

- To raise attainment in EYU, Phonics, KS1 and KS2
- To ensure all groups pupils make at least expected progress in reading and writing and maths
- To ensure children take ownership of their learning and understand their next steps
